





Change of polo shirt colour for **all** pupils and change of sweatshirts/cardigan colour for older pupils.
We understand that this new uniform will be gradually phased in, therefore there is no requirement to purchase new uniform until your child requires it.

Please note we still have our pop-up shop at each site and all uniform can be purchased from your local supermarket. It is not essential for you to purchase the uniform with the school logo. If you wish to purchase uniform from other suppliers, such as local supermarkets you are more than welcome to as long as they follow the school colours.

Our uniform supplier has changed to an online provider, Price and Buckland.
